- Attended ORRSC Board Meeting on March 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2023.
  - Take Away:
    - Mladen Kristic provided a thorough overview of the GIS system and the Asset Management component that is coming out. GIS can be customized for every municipality as well as track work order flows for operations.
    - Discussion over public participation in land use planning and the controversy at Thorhild County. ORRSC is only regional planning commission in the province, although there are other similarly structured corporate entities. As such, ORRSC is a very cost-effective option for its members when it comes to updating land use bylaws. Private firms can cost multiple times more money. The Thorhild County Land Use Bylaw update was well over six figures.

## **COUNCILLOR REPORT**

- Attended District 20 Fire Association Meeting on March 28th.
  - Take Away:
    - Discussed Societies Act requirements for providing audited financial statements with the annual return. Shared reporting template that is used by Friends of the Milo Library and does not require hiring an auditor if someone not on the board is willing to do the review. Discussed the potential and the benefits for adding wash bays onto the site of the existing fire hall, including the type of structure and how it could be funded.
- Attended Mine Road Water Co-op Meeting on March 28th.
  - Take Away:
    - This was there annual general meeting. I was told I could sit in on it at the fire
      association meeting which was immediately prior. Co-op reviewed their financial
      position, as well as chose their officers and directors. Lengthy discussion on the best
      way to approve new service connections, as well as how to secure the interests of the
      Co-op by way of agreements and registered legal instruments. Water supply does not
      appear to be a problem.
- Attended Vulcan County Communications Meeting.
  - Take Away:
    - Introduction of new CAOs and community updates were nice. Updates on changes to solid waste management were informative. The cost of recycling is becoming hard to justify. Material was circulated on the SAEWA project. Town of Vulcan very appreciative of County contributions to recreation and development of new rodeo grounds. Lyle Magnuson said that he is seeing an uptick of interest in industrial real estate.
- Constituent Matters:
  - Inquiries over obtaining gravel for driveways from the County. I referred them directly to Mike Kiemele to make arrangements.
  - MITACS Approval was received for the Locating Missing Graves Project on March 29<sup>th</sup>. The Villages of Carmangay, Lomond and Milo have all agreed to give \$500 each towards the project. The Milo Lions are giving \$2,000.00. The Lomond Lions are giving \$2,000.00. The Carmangay Historical Society is giving \$2,000.00. With all funding now in place, Vulcan County has issued the first term payment to MITACS.
